





Population 65 years and over, Canada, Historical (1971-2011) and Projected (2012-2061) (percent)







Figure 3: Proportion of population aged 60-plus by region in 2012, 2030 and 2050






The Rising Tide: Dementia

- According to the World Health Organization, approximately 35.6 million people around the globe are currently living with dementia. This number is expected to double by 2030 and more than triple by 2050. (new case every 4 seconds)
- Canadian statistics
- 2011 = 747 000 Canadians were living with Alzheimer's or related dementias
- 2031 = 1.4 million Canadians are expected to have the disease
- Age is a risk factor; Alzheimer's disease affects:
 - 5% of Canadians age 65 +
 - **25%** of those age 85 +


