## How Regulation happens

- Recognition that there is a 'risk of harm'
- Support for regulation within the profession(s)
- Government delegates to a profession(s) the power to regulate their peers



## Regulation of SW and SSW in Ontario

- Social Work and Social Service Work Act, 1998 (fully proclaimed 2000)
- Accountable to the Ministry of Community and Social Services
- Council → Registrar → Staff



## The College Mandate: Public Protection

- To protect the public interest from unqualified, incompetent or unfit practitioners
- Title protection and holding out provisions
- Public register




## Role of the College

- Sets registration requirements and protects the title for those with specialized academic qualifications who meet specific standards.
- Sets minimum professional standards: Code of Ethics and Standards of Practice.
- Supports ongoing learning: continuing competence and professional development.
- Provides oversight and maintains rigorous complaints and discipline processes.



## The Code of Ethics and Standards of Practice

- Code of Ethics and Standards of Practice Handbook, 2nd Edition, 2008
- 8 principles to guide practice and conduct which set out minimum standards for all members





## Standards of Practice

- I. Relationship with Clients
- II. Competence and Integrity
- III. Responsibility to Clients
- IV. The Social Work and Social Service Work Record
- V. Confidentiality
- VI. Fees
- VII. Advertising
- VIII.Sexual Misconduct



# Continuing Competence Program (CCP)

- Adult education model
- Mandatory for College members to complete each year
- Promotes quality assurance and encourages members to enhance their practice in an ongoing way



## Continuing Competence Program (CCP)

### Four steps to complete the CCP:

- 1. Review Standards of Practice and other required documents
- 2. Complete Self Assessment Tool
- 3. Complete Professional Development Plan and carry out learning activities
- 4. Complete Declaration of Participation part of annual renewal process



## Oversight and Discipline

- As the regulatory body for SW and SSW, the College has due processes in place to keep unfit, incompetent and unqualified individuals out of the profession.
- All Ontarians have a right to expect that their SW or SSW will be professional, ethical, qualified and accountable.



## To review:

- The College's mandate is to protect the public
- The College fulfills this mandate by:
  - Setting registration requirements
  - Maintaining Code of Ethics and Standards of Practice
  - Supporting members in ongoing learning
  - Providing oversight and discipline



## Registration Process

- Have transcript sent directly to College
- Submit Application Form with fees
- Allow 4-6 weeks for processing





## New Graduate Fee

- New graduates are a priority
  - You must apply for registration no later than December 31 of the year in which you graduate
  - You are then eligible for the new graduate fee for the two subsequent years



## SSW Equivalency

- Persons with a non-SSW diploma may apply through the equivalency stream
  - Two-year college of applied arts and technology (CAAT) diploma or equivalent
  - Courses from transcripts must meet 3 content areas
  - Work experience that includes 650 hours of supervision

## SW Equivalency

- Persons with a non-SW degree may apply through the equivalency stream
  - Four-year undergraduate degree
  - Courses from transcripts must meet 12 content areas
  - Work experience including supervision of 700 hours of practice by a social worker


